

INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL REPORT 2004-05

Part A

The plan of action chalked out by the IQAC in the beginning of the year towards quality enhancement and the outcome achieved by the end of the year 2004-05.

The Academic year 2004-05 began with all preparations for the oncoming 'NAAC inspection'.

The achievement of the students in academics :

The results of the previous academic year 2003-04 were highly satisfactory 92% in B.A. Final. Miss Padmashree Naryanachar Joshi of B.Sc. III Secured 9th Rank in the University Examinations. The PG course in Music achieved 100% results in this academic year. Admission took place and during this academic year 682 students were admitted. The college began its activities with 39 full time staff, 18 part time staffs and 26 non-teaching staff.

Teachers' Achievements for the year:

Dr. Swamirao Kulkarni Principal has to his credit many literary works this year also. He has written a collection of thoughts by name of "Banaangaladinada" edited a book published by Prasaranga G.U.G. and another book called 'Nota' that gives on an introductory points of the college. In Rangoli Shilpa Subedar of B.Sc.IIyr har got First prize. Our college team was the over all runners-up this academic year.

‘Prathibha’ Gulbarga Youth Festival 2005 was organized and the students of our college have bagged many prizes,. Kum. Swati Joshi of B.A. I has won II Prize in classical vocal, In group song the students got I prize and in Mime, III prize, Kum. Indira Hosmani has won III prize in Painting.

A student by name T.M. Vijaysingh has won consolation prize in one act play competition at government degree college and in devotional song singing competition on the eve of Gandhi Jayanti. The Reaccreditation process started with the visit of Prof .K Banad Rangayya,NAAC Officer, Bangalore on 29-09-2004.

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the institution

Gulbarga University Gulbarga had discontinued bachelor's degree of Library Science at the graduate level. Library & Information Science is offered at present only as an optional subject for B.A. students. This subject is available only in a few colleges and ours is one of them. But for employment opportunities it was not enough. Hence to benefit the students our college is trying its best to get affiliation from Makhanlal Chaturvedi Patrakarita Vishwavidyalaya, Bhopal. Which is a recognized University by U.G.C. in all probability we will start the course from the next academic year.

2. New academic programmes initiated (UG and PG):

There was a long standing demand to start Haridasa Research Centre in Gulbarga University Gulbarga, our principal Dr. Swamirao Kulkarni was appointed as a member of high power committee for the establishment of 'Haridasa Peetha' at Raichur. He took keen interest in preparing the statute regulations and accumulation of financial resources. The committee is actively working towards the starting of the research center.

Apart from this he was also nominated to the syllabus revision committee of Gulbarga University.

Smt. Nagaratna Patil has been appointed as BOE & BOS chairman of Fine Arts by GUG . The dept of computer science conducted computer awareness programmes for BA & B.Com students for two months (August & Sept 2004).

An orientation programme as per the guidelines of district task force on higher education was held on 30th July 2004 to acquaint the new comers of BA,BCOM and BSc with the institution , teachers and resources available in the college.

3) Innovations in curricular design and transaction: Many of our college teachers were in the board of studies and board of examiners of Gulbarga University. They have actively involved themselves in preparing the syllabus for semester system. Many of staff members are on BOE and BOS panel of University and hence instrumental in framing and adopting the changes in syllabus for semester system. Affiliating system has limited our innovations to

only teaching skills and have attempted to involve interesting ways of transmitting information to students. Role play and quiz techniques were successfully implemented in a few subjects.

A quiz after every chapter in history subject could build competitive spirit thorough study and a feeling of elation among students. As usual two class tests in each subject and a preparatory examination in the first of week of February helped the students to get assessed themselves.

Visits to art galleries and libraries helped our fine art and library science students to get wide exposure and discussions with artists helped them learn finer points in fine arts.

4. Inter-disciplinary programmes started: It is true but shocking to digest the fact that there is no provision in our syllabi for commerce and arts students to take degree with computers. Usually students learn usage of computers in private institutes outside the college premises. But this education comes with a heavy cost which most of the students cannot afford. Realising this difficulty we started computer classes for all the students of our college irrespective of their faculties at a nominal cost.

Expression in English is the greatest demand of job-givers. But it is also the greatest disadvantage of rural area job seekers. To overcome this spoken English classes were conducted for the interested students as a separate course after the regular working hours in the college itself.

Our college results are highly satisfactory. But the dim line is still visible. To remove this we have conducted remedial classes with partial support from UGC for academically weaker students. This has helped the students to come out of their inhibitions and get through the examinations.

5. Examination reforms implemented: Examination reforms is an unending and continuous process. Our past experience of conducting two class tests in each subject has proved beneficial to the students. Hence we continued this process with an addition of counselling to the students who remained absent and to those who did not fair well. The counseling has brought up good results. A preparatory examination in the first week of February is held every year to acquaint students with the type and model of university examinations.

As a new experiment central evaluation was held so that all our students get their answer papers evaluated at the earliest. Necessary guidance suggestions and consultations helped in removing the examination nervousness among students. To our pleasure a few of the studious students came asking for question banks. The trend was encouraged.

by all teachers by providing such students with variety of questions on different subjects.

All these efforts are getting around 90% results in the annual examinations. Our aim is to cover even the 10%. Hence apart from teachers we are also consulting students and parents to come up with result promotional suggestions and ideas.

A rare opportunity was provided to our commerce students to shoulder the responsibility of launching and canvassing the Tata Indicom Mobiles & Phones from 26th Nov 2004 to 28th Nov 2004. 90 students of our college participated in this programme.

Department of Computer Science conducted “ Computer awareness programme” for B.A. & B.Com students from August 4th 2004 to Sept 4th 2004.

The department also held a seminar on current trends in information technology on 25th Jan 2005.

Science Faculty organized a National Level seminar on “ Promotion of Basic Sciences” on 23rd March 2005. this seminar was sponsored by UGC. Eminent Scientist from Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore participated and presented papers on unique topics. For students computer training is provided in the first term for two months. Internet facility is available for students on all working days during working hours.

28. Financial aid to students:

- 1) GOI scholarship is given to 116 students

- 2) Defence scholarship to one student
- 3) BCM scholarship to 22 students
- 4) Sanchi Honnamma scholarship to one student.

Apart from the above many meritorious students are awarded with cash prizes.

29. Activities and support from the Alumni Association: As usual our Alumni association is collecting voluntary donations from students and the funds so collected is utilized for the student development activities.

30 Activities and support from the Parent-Teacher Association: Parent teacher association is meeting twice a year and discussing about the facilities available facilities to be provided and the future of our students. But so far the association has not come up with any financial support to the college and its activities. However their guidance is of immense help to the progress of our college.

31. Health services: On management committee member Dr. Gautam Jahagirdar is an ophthalmist, and was kind enough to arrange a free eye check-up camp for our students. As a part of their routine the dental college had come to our college for free dental check up.

32. Performance in sports activities:

The sports advisory committee of the college held its meeting in the second week of July and finalized the annual sports time table for the year 2004-05. The department of sports and games conducted all the programmes according to the schedule with a few minor changes. The highlight of the year was that Sri Sharnagouda Arikeri BScII and Vikramaditya A BSc III were selected for the Gulbarga University cricket team and represented our university in the inter university cricket tournament. Sri Rajkumar Shinde of BA II year won silver medal in Hammer throw in the inter collegiate athletic meet held at Koppal.

33. Incentives to outstanding sportspersons: The regular incentives like diet for the selected athletes and track suit for University Blues were continued this year also.

34. Student achievements and awards:

In the year 2004-05 22 students bagged various cash prizes in the different subjects of study for their outstanding performances. Apart from this one student

from each faculty was selected as the best student of the year for his /her academic and extra curricular performances.

Govt of India merit scholarships was received by 116 students of our college. one student received Defence scholarship. Backward and minorities scholarship was received by 22 students. The special scholarship of Sanchi Honnamma for one language student. This award is instituted by Govt of Karnataka.

35. Activities of the Guidance and Counselling unit: Career Guidance Counseling and News Writers Forum: on 30th July 2004, the CGC and NWF was inaugurated by Dr. Murudkar and Prof. R. H. Hanamasagar spoke on 'English for competitive examinations' On 7th August 2004 Sri. R.M.Mannur, Editor Satyakama spoke on 'Importance of Newspaper', and Sri T.V.Shivanandan a reporter of the Hindu spoke on 'Press writing- An Art' on 12th September, 2004 and on 19th September a General Knowledge Test on Gandhiji was organized.

On 1st October, 2004 10 girl participants of CGC attended a special lecture programme of Prof. Krishna Reddy, Hyderabad organized by Brain Hub at V.G.Women's College, Gulbarga. Some students of this cell who belonged to commerce department attended an interactive seminar on 'Career opportunities in Management in the changing environment'. This was organized by ICFAI at Aditya Hotel, Gulbarga on 19th October 2004. A book 'Brain Train' was edited by Prof.P.C.Deshpande (convenor), Prof. Hemant Kumar and Dr.Shrikant Ekhelikar (Co-ordinators) and was released on 11th December 2004. The members of the forum attended a book exhibition called 'Book Meet' organized by ICFAI. Besides all these the advertisement inviting applications for training, job of district science centre, Gulbarga, staff selection commission, New Delhi. Udayonmukh Varadigara Vedike, Gulbarga etc. were also brought to the notice of the students at regular intervals. 95 CGC students participated in Tata Indicom mobile advertisement promotion campaign for three days held at veerashaiva kalyan mantap, Gulbarga.

36. Placement services provided to students:

An official inauguration of the placement cell was held this year to guide the students and to provide placement information about the employment

opportunities. Dr Srikant Ekhelikar and Shri Govind Pujar of our college were deputed to participate in the Train the trainer programme for enhancement of skills at Infosys Hyderabad .

37. Development programmes for non-teaching staff:

Our college office has a very enthusiastic staff the work is done promptly by them in recording the files of different sections. The staff were assisted by our teachers of computer science department to train themselves in recording their activities in the computer.

38. Healthy practices of the institution

All the earlier healthy practices that helped us in the realization of our Vision and Mission were continued with the full enthusiasm and dedication. A randomly selected group from each class were provided an opportunity with interact with the Principal and faculty members for improvement of academic infrastructural and co curricular issues. Though hesitantly a few students come up with novel ideas which were inculcated. As a result a book issue incharge in the library was appointed in the evening hours when students make use of the library at the time of examinations.
